All academy children must be dropped off and picked up from the main academy gate. We ask that parents please do not come on site unless they have an appointment. Due to the number of children being dropped off and picked up, we would request that, wherever possible, you walk your child to school. Lintot Square can be used to park and stride if you are coming from outside the village.

We ask that parents leave as soon as they have dropped their child at the academy gate, or picked them up, and do not wait around as there is not sufficient space to allow for this especially when cars are trying to park. We would also please ask that parents observe all current social distancing guidance when dropping off and picking up, and please wear masks where possible.

We have tried to arrange as small a wait as possible for those families with siblings. We understand that in this instance it may be necessary for parents to wait for their next drop off or pick up slot. In this case, please avoid waiting on the pavement directly outside the academy gate as this blocks the entry for other children.

Uniform

School uniform should be worn at all times, and we suggest that this is washed or changed regularly where possible. On days where your child is doing PE we will ask them to come to the academy dressed in their PE kit, and they will stay in this all day. Please do not bring PE bags to school. Your child's class teacher will contact you to remind you of the PE days for your child. We ask that children with pierced ears please have their earrings removed before coming to the academy on a PE day, as earrings can get caught on PE equipment and cause serious harm. If you are unable to remove your child's earrings, please ensure that you have put medical tape over them before sending your child to school, and that your child knows not to remove this. Unfortunately, teachers cannot put tape over earrings for children under the current guidance.

What to bring

A named water bottle (no juice or squash please) a raincoat and a sun hat are all very important. If your child is bringing their own lunch, a lunch box that is easily washable is helpful. No rucksacks or big bags should be brought to the academy, as we cannot have these in the cloakroom. A bookbag, or similar sized bag, that will fit in your child's tray should be sent in instead, and this will be used to send home books and letters.

We ask that children please do not bring toys, teddies, comforters or other such items from home due to the risk of infection that these bring. If your child brings a toy with them on their journey to school, we will ask you to please take it home with you when you drop it off. Thank you for your support with this.

Illness

If your child is ill, please call the academy office between 8.30am and 9.30am to let us know.

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea, they should be kept at home for 48 hours from the last episode of sickness or diarrhoea.

You must not bring your child to the academy if they are showing symptoms of Covid-19:

- a fever
- a continuous cough
- a loss or change in sense of taste or smell

If your child has one or more of these symptoms, they should be kept at home and isolated for 10 days from the start of the symptoms. Please call us to let us know, or email covid@southwaterinfants.co.uk. We would recommend arranging a test for your child through the NHS. Tests are quick and straightforward, and if your child tests negative, and they are well enough, they can return to the academy the next day. If you choose not to

have a test your child must remain at home for at least 10 days, or until they are better.

If your child develops symptoms while at the academy we will call you immediately and ask you, or a nominated adult to come and collect them. It is important that your contact details are correct, and that there is someone who can collect your child within 30 minutes. Please let the academy office know if you need to update or change any contact details. Again, we would recommend getting your child tested in these circumstances.

If your child tests positive for Covid-19 please let the academy know as soon as possible. If we receive notification of a positive test at the academy, we will follow the advice of Public Health England regarding follow up action and who should isolate.

Lunches

Easy Lunch will be providing hot lunches as they have done previously for all children who wish to have one. All infant children are entitled to a free hot meal, which can be ordered through the office.

Lunches will be eaten in the classrooms to minimise the risk of children mixing across bubbles.

Playtimes

Morning and lunch playtimes will be staggered to ensure that groups of children on the playground remain small, and that the bubble groups avoid mixing as much as possible.

After school clubs

At the moment we are not holding any after school clubs for the children, and anticipate that this will remain the case throughout the Spring term, after which we will review the situation.

Medication

If your child has medication, such as an asthma inhaler, that will be kept at the infant academy, could we please ask that you fill in the medication form on the academy website and bring this with you, along with your child's medication in the original box with the pharmacy sticker on. This only applies for children who have not yet attended the academy this term and therefore have not returned their medication after Christmas.

First Aid and Safeguarding

Throughout the lockdown period we have ensured that a Safeguarding Lead and relevant First Aiders have been on site at the academy. This will remain the same from September to ensure the safety of all the children. First aid will be administered by academy staff, with more serious incidents dealt with in the academy office.

Learning

Children will be learning in their class bubbles throughout the day, with their class teacher(s) and TA. Academy staff will be supporting children with their learning exactly as they have always done, and children will be encouraged to develop confidence and independence in learning. We will be ensuring that the learning meets the needs of all children, and takes into account the experiences that children have had during lockdown. While we will be focussing on the important core skills, we will also ensure that the curriculum learning is broad and balanced and allows children to be immersed in rich and creative learning experiences.
